# **Our Mission**

The mission of the Nicollet County Historical Society shall be the discovery, preservation, and dissemination of knowledge about the history of Nicollet County and the State of Minnesota.

# 65,861 Served in 2015\*

he Nicollet County Historical Society has worked very hard during the 2015 year. We received multiple grant awards, including just over \$30,000 to hire someone to work on our three-dimensional collections. We received a grant to have a new website made and did some rebranding during this process, putting forward a fresh face for the coming year. We celebrated the grand opening of the new landscaping at the Treaty Site History Center and saw increased merchandise and admission sales at both the Harkin Store and Fort Ridgely.

Our outreach to both locals and those around the country increased in 2015, as well. Over 240,000 people heard monthly updates about NCHS on KNUJ radio out of New Ulm. An astonishing 1.2 million people viewed the Commemorating Controversy exhibit at the National Museum of the American Indian in Washington, D.C.\* We continue to be a leader in county historical societies within Minnesota and this increased outreach helps us keep that reputation.

The hard work that took place in 2015 also led us to be selected as one of six host communities in Minnesota for the Smithsonian's "Museums on Main Street" program. For six weeks in August and September of 2016 the Treaty Site History Center will host an exhibit called *Water/Ways*; providing over eight weeks of corresponding programming during that time. NCHS will also be creating a locally-focused exhibit about our water history. The time and effort our staff put into securing the chance to host this exhibit is impressive; we are looking forward to this opportunity.

Our mission is to discover, preserve and disseminate the history of Nicollet County. The hard work of 2015 is a tribute to the exciting things to come in the years ahead.
