

NCHS Annual Meeting, Canceled Due to COVID-19

our NCHS Board of Directors voted to cancel the 2020 NCHS Annual Meeting due to coronavirus concerns. The Board explored several options, including holding an in-person meeting later in the year and a virtual meeting in January. After much discussion, it was decided the safest measure was to cancel the meeting.

We recognize that not all our members have access to the technology and Wi-Fi bandwidth that would allow them to participate in a virtual meeting. We value all of our members and want to ensure that you can take part in this meeting.

Even though we're canceling the Annual Meeting, we still have business to conduct. Per Article XIII -Amendment 1 of the NCHS Bylaws, the Board amended our bylaws to allow voting by ballot. A ballot for each voting member *listed on your membership* will be mailed in mid-January. The 2020 NCHS Annual Report will be available on our website in late January.
