Nicollet County Historical Society Annual Meeting Minutes Sunday, March 26 2023, at 1:30 p.m. Treaty Site History Center


- I. The NCHS annual meeting was called to order at 1:34 p.m. by President Kate Martens.
- II. The agenda was approved
- III. Secretary's report: NCHS Secretary Dana Melius read the minutes from the 2022 Annual Meeting, which were approved.
- IV. Treasurer's report: Outgoing NCHS Treasurer Ken Rossow presented the treasurer's report and said that despite a couple of huge capital improvement projects (about \$55,000 for roof repairs to the Treaty Site building; about \$40,000 painting of the Cox House), along with a dip of some \$19,000 in the Mairs & Powers fund due to the market declines, the NCHS remains in solid financial condition. The two-page financials was presented as part of the meeting packet. The NCHS had 2022 revenues of \$261,625.72, with a boost of \$82,454.34 in federal COVID support. Expenses totaled \$240,344.52. The NCHS Balance Sheet as of December 31, 2022 was also presented, with total NCHS assets at \$1,154,792.02. The treasurer's report was approved.
- V. Executive Director Jessica Becker and President Kate Martens presented a Year in Review report. For the first full year being open since the COVID shutdown, over 2,800 individuals attended the museum, and it was a record year for field trips, most often handled by James Irhke, Operations Coordinator. Besides the NCHS sponsored events during 2022, the Board of Directors held two strategy retreats and committee restructuring, and new mission and vision statements. But it was mentioned that there remain facilities challenges with both the Treaty Site History Center and the Cox House, as well as on the development side: How do we build the NCHS? There are currently 252 members.
- VI. Elections: Scott Hermanson of Saint Peter and John Hurd of North Mankato were newlyelected to the board by voice vote, and Tami Skinner of Saint Peter was elected to a full second term. Officer candidates were elected as follows: President Kate Martens, Vice President Tami Skinner, Treasurer Denny Schmidt, Secretary Dana Melius. Outgoing Treasurer Ken Rossow was thanked for his service. Special thanks was also mentioned for outgoing board member Ray Jacobson for his years of service and volunteering.
- VII. The annual meeting portion of the afternoon was adjourned at 2:12 p.m.
- VIII. Special guest speaker following the annual meeting was Steve Ketcham, a retired teacher and collector who gave a presentation on the history of the patent medicine industry.


